

 - between and among the party members

 strive for implementing these common policies at EU level;



 coordinate election campaigns for the European Parliament on request of the member parties;



 organize Pan-European assemblies, conferences and conventions





 act as a contact for the European institutions and representatives to the European Pirate movement



 establish the Pirate movement in the public's eye, the European Union and Europe as a whole



 voice and broadcast for its member parties policies and discussions of interest on request of its members.

- English is the
 - Working language
 - Language for official documents
 - Translations allowed, but:
 - English version is binding one



- Council represents PPEU for judicial acts
- Chairman represents Council for judicial acts
- Board binds PPEU for day to day management



The members of the Association shall adopt a Common Manifesto which shall reflect the principles and policies of the European Pirate movement.

 Note: legal requirement for recognition as party at European Level

The PPEU does not interfere with the relations of delegate and the delegate's party.

PPEU does not interfere with the souvereignity of its members.

Membership Overview

- Min. 10 members from ¼ of EU countries
- Non natural persons are legal entitities or appoint a natural person
- Five categories; Ordinary, Associate, Observer, Supporting, Special
 - Ord.+Assoc: Vote, speak, policy, participate
 - Observer: participate
 - Supporting: participate
- Fee: fix base + variable pillar

Membership 10

 Minimum 10 members from ¼ EU member states



Membership 10

 All members except Parlamentarian Members are legal entities in their country or appoint a natural person to act in its name

Membership 10

- There are five categories for members:
 - Ordinary
 - Associate
 - Observer
 - Parliamentarian
 - Special



Ordinary Membership 20

- Eligible as Ordinary Members are all parties which
 - are political parties in Europe (registered or intend to be registered)
 - Party has filed for running in an election at regional, national or EU level
 - not subordinate to any other party
 - carry the term "Pirate" or any translation or inflection of that term somewhere in their party name,,
 - maintain a democratic political base and a democratic internal structure,

Ordinary Membership 20

- They have the following obligations:
 - Does not harm to PPEU
 - to regularly attend Council meetings of the Association,
 - Maintain transparency including financial transparency towards its members
 - to pay their designated fee as Ordinary Members in a timely manner and
 - to report every year to the Association on party and policy developments.



Ordinary Membership 20

- They have the following rights:
 - to vote in the Council on every matter,
 - to participate in the political discussions and to speak at Council meetings,
 - to appoint delegates and propose candidates for the Board and
 - to have access to use of the Associations logo and other representational devices.

Associate Membership 30

- Eligible as Associate Members are all parties which
 - Are a political parties in EU candidate or EFTA countries
 - not subordinate
 - carry the term "Pirate" or any translation of that term somewhere in their party name,
 - intend to participate in elections in their country or state, if legally possible and feasible,
 - maintain a democratic political base and a democratic internal structure,

Associate Membership 30

- They have the following obligations:
 - Does not harm PPEU
 - to regularly attend Council meetings of the Association,
 - to stay politically active and participate in elections, if possible and feasible,
 - Maitain transparency
 - to pay their designated fee as Associate Members in a timely manner and
 - to report every year to the Association on party and policy developments.
 - Non compliance leads to measurements up to cessation of voting rights.

Associate Membership 30

They have the following rights:

- to vote in the Council on every matter, except for decisions involving the policies and structure
 of the European Union or its institutional system,
- to participate in the political discussions and to speak at Council meetings,
- to appoint delegates and arbitrators and propose candidates for the Board and
- to have access to use of the Associations logo and other representational devices.
- Automatic conversion to Ordianry Membership if country joins EU

Observer membership 40

Eligible as Observer Members are organisations that:

Maintain transparency including financial transparency towards its members
